SCHOOL RETAKE PHOTOS



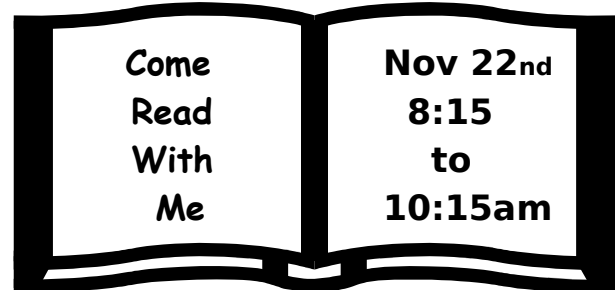

HEAD LICE

Please check your children at home at least once a week for head lice. If you find any, please treat immediately, and report it to the school so that we can take steps to keep them under control. Vigilance by the home is the best way to control the spread of head lice. Remember, it isn't enough to just use the shampoo. Some lice are immune. Removal of all the nits (eggs) from the hair after treatment is necessary to prevent hatching. It only takes one live louse to lay hundreds of eggs.



We will be continuing with our Bert Edwards tradition of afternoon costumes and "Halloween Train" this year (classes walk around the school in costumes) and will be celebrating Halloween on Tuesday October 31st. Students will be able to dress up in

their costumes after lunch on the 31st; they can bring costumes to school in packs and change after lunch. Please talk to your child's teacher regarding sweets, and bringing treats to school, as the children will likely be into PLENTY of sweets on Halloween. Look for additional information from our classroom teachers coming home prior to Halloween.

FACILITIES REVIEW PROCESS — Significant enrolment pressures in some parts of the district

has created the need for a full facilities review to determine if there are options to consider as the District grapples with these growth pressures. Options may include the opening of schools

previously closed, reconfiguration of existing schools or new bus routes to move students from

some schools to others.
